A Scheme of Work for Key Stage Two

- A. Focus: Hi 2/2.1c A study of an aspect of local history and a related site, dating from a period beyond 1066, and which is significant in the locality.
- **B.** Aims, to develop:
 - 1. The use of historical vocabulary and the deployment of correct terms.
 - 2. An understanding of the importance of evidence and how knowledge is derived from a range of sources.
 - **3.** The ability to respond to evidence by organising and selecting evidence, then starting to build narratives.
